Giovanna Campani, full professor at the University of Florence, teaches Cultural Anthropology, Gender Anthropology and Intercultural communication. Her professional profile was built in a multi-and-interdisciplinary field involving contributions from sociology, ethnology and education. Since 1989, she has been coordinator or partner in a great number of European projects, in various programs. Recent publications include three books and several articles on the populist phenomenon in Europe, Campani G., Lazaridis G. (2017), Understanding the Populist shift, Routledge, London, New York; Campani G., Lazaridis, G., Benveniste A. (2016), The Rise of the Far Right in Europe, Palgrave, Macmillan, London; Campani G., Stanghellini, G. (2014), I populismi nella crisi europea, Pacini, Pisa; Campani G. (2017), Media, Web, Democracy: populist and postpopulist Europe in the mirror of the Italian experience in IAF, International Affairs Forum, Spring 2017, 2(1). In the last years, she has also extensively written on the migration crisis in Europe.
